Know all men by these presents that I Jotham White of Charlestown in the County of Cheshire and State of New Hampshire Gent.- For and in consideration of the sum of Forty Pounds lawful money to me in hand before the Delivery hereof paid by Stephen Jacob Hsq. of Windsor in the County of Windsor and State of Vermont, do hereby sell and deliver to the said Stephen Jacob, my Negro Woman Slave, named Dinah, about thirty years of age.

To have and to hold the said Negro Woman Slave to the said Stephen Jacob his heirs and assigns forever, and I the said Jotham White for myself my heirs Executors and administrators do by these presents covenant and engage with the said Stephen Jacob, that I am the sole and lawful owner of the said Negro Woman and that I will Warrant and Defend the said Negro Woman Slave to him the said Stephen Jacob his heirs and assigns against the lawful Claims and Demands of all persons whatsoever. In Witness whereof I hereunto set my hand and seal this 26th Day of July anno Domini 1783 Signed Sealed and Delivered
